



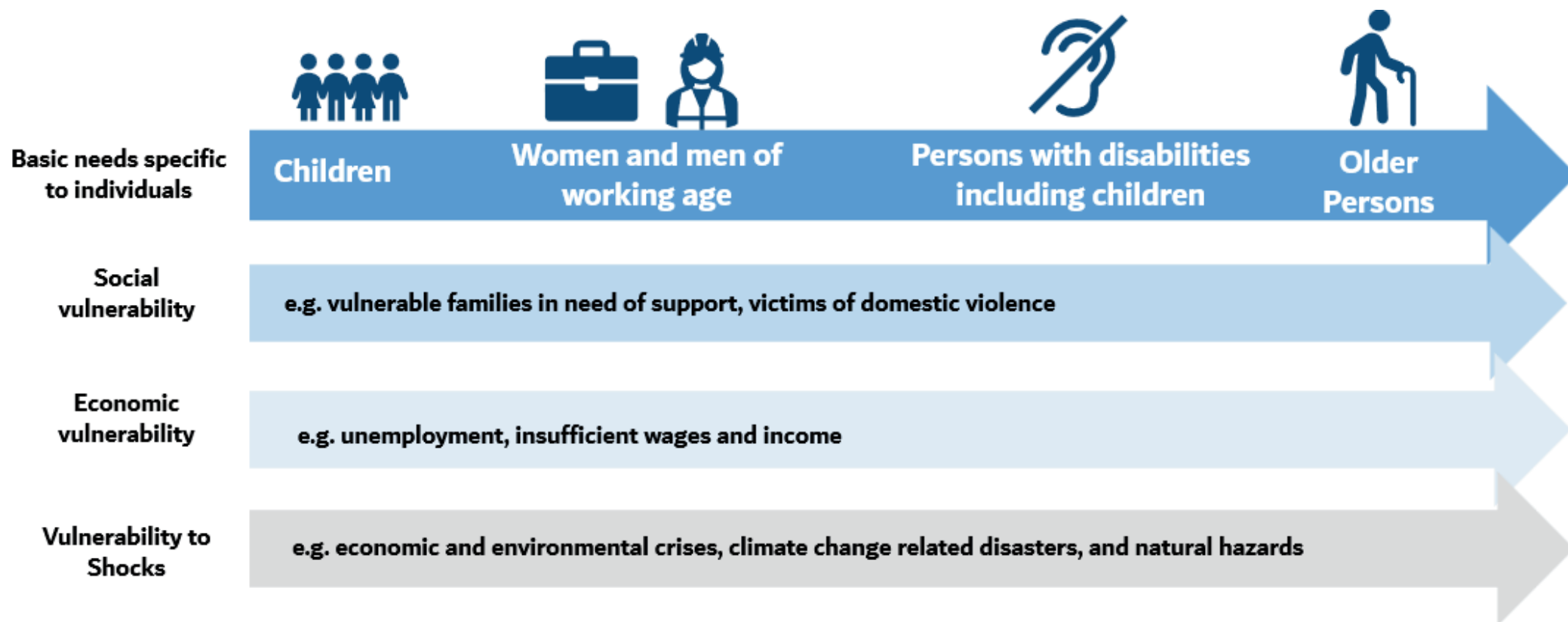

Summary



Scope of the NSPS and Target Groups

Social protection refers to a set of programs, services, and policies that enable families and individuals to meet their basic needs and cope with social and economic shocks throughout different stages of their lives.

Mission: Enhancing inclusiveness and sustainability of the social protection system and its capacity to provide integrated and coordinated social services and opportunities for economic participation, for families and individuals throughout the different stages of life, and enabling them to meet their basic needs, overcome shocks, and contribute to building an active and productive society

Objectives of the Updated NSPS



Expanding the coverage and scope of social protection and reaching wider segments of society



Raising the efficiency and effectiveness of expenditure on social protection



Enhancing complementarity and integration between programmes, including through digitalisation



Strengthening shock-responsiveness of the social protection system



Enhancing the role of civil society and the private sector in social protection



Raising community awareness and strengthening communication mechanisms in the social protection sector

Medium-Term Outcomes



Targeted and coordinated social assistance programs providing diverse and complementary benefits

- Expand the unified social registry
- Establish a unified application portal to include at least 6 programmes by 2028
- Improve targeting mechanisms through the social registry
- Establish cash transfers for vulnerable groups (older persons, PWDs, and children)
- Develop a phased plan to harmonise and consolidate duplicated programmes through a phase plan
- Develop an action plan to coordinate between Zakat endowment, and social protection programmes



Social assistance programmes designed to enhance human capital

- Develop and implement a roadmap to expand the Takaful Plus programme, including new legislation on additional services
- Increase economic empowerment pathways for cash assistance beneficiaries (allocated quotas in national employment training programmes)
- Improve the targeting of children in NAF and those on waiting lists to benefit from access to school feeding, childcare and early childhood education programmes
- Develop a roadmap for the institutionalisation and expansion of the national school feeding programme

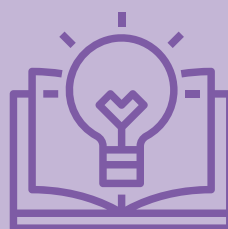

Empowered human capital through enhanced access to integrated, inclusive and high quality education, health and social care

Medium-Term Outcomes



Inclusive and effective social care services

- Professionalise social work and implement capacity building
- Implement a classification mechanism for civil society organisations
- Establish a Social Protection Dialogue Forum to enhance cooperation between civil society and the government
- Enhance the role of the private sector through coordinating corporate social responsibility
- Activate the Social Protection and Care Fund
- Enhance the implementation of inclusive services and referral mechanisms



Inclusive education and training services

- Increase enrollment in and capacity of early childhood education
- Link out-of-school children to social protection programmes to facilitate reintegration into education and access to services
- Improve the school environment in remote and vulnerable areas
- Increase enrollment rates for children with disabilities at all educational levels and develop inclusive curricula
- Vocational guidance and counselling for the most vulnerable groups



Comprehensive primary health care

- Establish a unified social health insurance programme based on the national social registry for its targeting process
- Expand health insurance coverage for children between 6 and 18
- Enhance access to primary and comprehensive healthcare services and ensure high quality service delivery

A productive and active society through a dynamic labor market and access to decent work

Medium-Term Outcomes



Sustainable social security providing comprehensive protection for all workers

- Increase the proportion of workers covered by social security
- Develop a roadmap to reduce informal work
- Enhanced social security mechanisms for part-time, flexible, platform workers and other types of emerging work modalities



Decent working conditions for workers in all sectors

- Enhance protection of all workers and raising community awareness of labour rights
- Promote women's economic participation by improving working conditions, facilitating remote work, providing childcare and accessible transportation
- Develop action plan to enhance PWDs' participation in the labour market



Effective labour market programs that build skills to meet labor market requirements

- Develop a national policy to enhance skills for future jobs in line with the Economic Modernisation Vision
- Implement cash for work programmes quotas for social assistance beneficiaries and vulnerable groups
- Enhance the effectiveness of public spending on labour market programs

Medium-Term Outcomes



Institutionalized and effective
coordination mechanisms for social
protection preparedness and
response to shocks

- Establish a coordination unit for shock-responsive social protection (leveraging the structure of the Emergency Committee for COVID-19 Response)
- Establish an emergency financing mechanism within the Social Protection Fund
- Institutionalise and increase emergency allocations in the national budget (budget lines for SRSP)



Adapted infrastructure and
rapid response to crises and
shocks

- Develop a social early-warning system and linking it with the NCSCM and other institutions
- Develop GIS maps linking early warning systems with locations of vulnerable populations and civil society organisations



Resilient and shock-
responsive programmes
and services

- Develop standard operating procedures (SOPs) including varying packages of social protection programmes on different emergency scenarios
- Train 70%+ of social protection sector personnel on SOPs
- Unify emergency response programmes provided by various institutions and harmonise targeting approaches

Key Enablers for the Successful Implementation of the NSPS 2025-2023



Institutional arrangements for NSPS Implementation

- Institutional framework for monitoring and implementing the updated NSPS
 - Higher steering committee with representation from government entities, the private sector and civil society organisations
- National Coordination Committees for the Pillars (Karama, Fursa, Tamkeen, Sumood) within MoSD under NSPS Implementation Monitoring Unit and Costed Action Plan



Unified Social Registry

- Develop a Unified Social Registry and enhance the use of technology, including artificial intelligence to ensure data accuracy and integration
- Launch of unified digital platform for registration in social protection programmes



Enhancing the Role of Social Workers and Strengthening National Case Management Approaches

- Regulate social worker professionalisation and licensing schemes, enhance the implementation of case management and referrals coupled with:
 - Comprehensive Assessment of Beneficiaries' Needs
 - Monitoring and Impact Evaluation
 - Training and Capacity Building



Partnership with the Private Sector and Civil Society Organisations (CBO)

Enhance partnership with private sector and civil society organisations through:

- Establishing regulations for Corporate Social Responsibility
- Establishing a National Social Protection and Care Fund
- Linking CBO programmes within the Unified Social Registry
- Classification of CBOs based on their services and capacities
- Launching joint programmes between the private sector and CBOs
